

AUTHENTICITY HIGH SCHOOL LESSON PLAN

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LESSON PLAN

MODULE OVERVIEW

The goal of this module is for students to recognize examples of authenticity in their own lives and to identify the benefits and challenges of demonstrating authenticity. This lesson will be delivered in two parts: An in-class lesson the first week and a peer-to-peer discussion period the following week.

LEARNING GOALS

To recognize examples of authenticity in our lives and to identify the challenges and benefits of demonstrating authenticity.

Success Criteria

I can define authenticity;

I can recognize examples of authenticity in the world;

I can give examples of the benefits of authenticity;

I can give examples of situations when it is hard to show authenticity;

I can practice authenticity by staying true to my values and beliefs while by being genuine;

I can apply authenticity by making sure that my actions match my words and values;

I can understand that authenticity is important for my well-being and that of others.

TEACHER SKILL REFERENCE

WHAT IS AUTHENTICITY?

Authenticity is a skill and takes practice! Authenticity is:

- The quality of being genuine or real
- Representing your true self instead of what you think others want you to be
- Staying true to your beliefs
- Trustworthiness
- Believability and truthfulness
- Being comfortable with yourself
- When your actions match your words and values

WHY DOES AUTHENTICITY MATTER? How DOES IT HELP US?

Authenticity is our ability to be our genuine selves, staying true to our values and beliefs, while still adapting to the world around us. Authenticity comes from having actions that match the words we say and not trying to be someone else to impress others. Authenticity helps us to feel confident in ourselves and it improves others ability to trust us, a characteristic highly valued in leaders. It also helps us create strong friendships and is a very important part of wellbeing.

RESEARCH BASED OUTCOMES OF AUTHENTICITY

- 1. Improves self respect and self esteem
- 2. Increases your comfort in sharing your true thoughts and beliefs
- 3. Improves emotional stability
- 4. Genuine smiles (over polite smiles) improve our social interactions
- 5. Improves our trustworthiness
- 6. Improves overall wellbeing

7. Helps us stand up for what we think is right, which reduces bullying

How To Find Stories Of Authenticity

Stories of authenticity involve the choice to be yourself and to follow your own dreams instead of what others may expect you to be. They are about being the change you want to see in the world and letting your actions reflect how you truly feel. Authentic people often have very interesting stories and have followed a path that may be different from others. They have a set of values they live by, even when that may be difficult. They may stand out as the genuinely kind people in the room or the ones that care less about social pressure and more about what makes them truly happy.

Themes:

- Practicing what you preach
- Knowing what you can and cannot change
- Doing the right thing, even when nobody is looking
- Not worrying about what others think more than what you think
- Knowing your true feelings and having the courage to share them
- Questioning stereotypes
- Being your true self whether that means you are different or the same as others
- Standing up for what is right
- Self-confidence

Suggested Guiding Questions To Accompany Stories:

- a. The umbrella skills help you get through life's rain and take on new challenges. Is there an example of rain in this story? (something outside the persons control?) What about a new challenge?
- b. How does the skill we are studying play a role in the story you just heard? How did it improve wellbeing for the person using this skill? How did it improve the wellbeing of others?
- c. Practicing the umbrella skills helps us use them more in our lives. How might this person's current experience help them in other ways throughout their lives?

- d. Our umbrella of emotional wellbeing is made up of many skills. At any given time we use the ones that best help us overcome the obstacle we are facing. When could this skill help us the most? Can you think of other situations when this skill is very helpful?
- e. Did you notice any other umbrella skills in this video or book?
